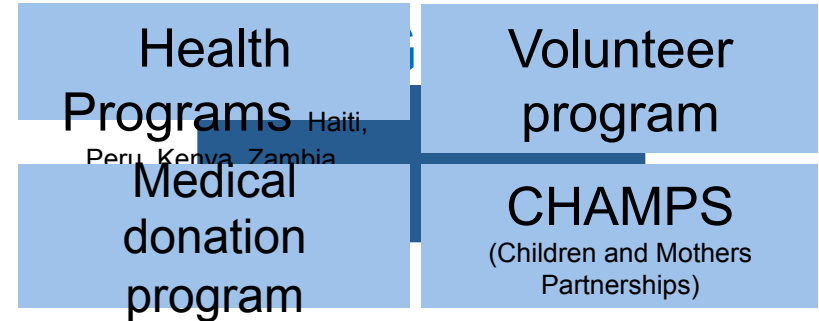

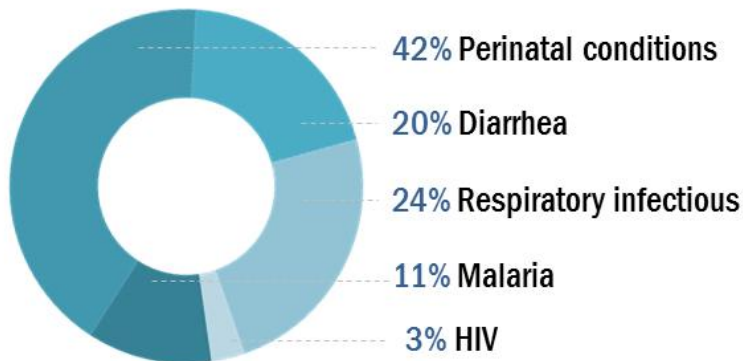

Focus: Women and

6.6M Children children under five years old die per year (75% of all deaths) from 5 preventable diseases



287,000 women die every year at birth in the developing world. Their families are **55%** more likely to experience the loss of a child.

HIV is still killing over 740,000 women per year.

Increases in cardiovascular, diabetes, breast cancer and cervical cancer make **chronic diseases** a new epidemic in the developing world.

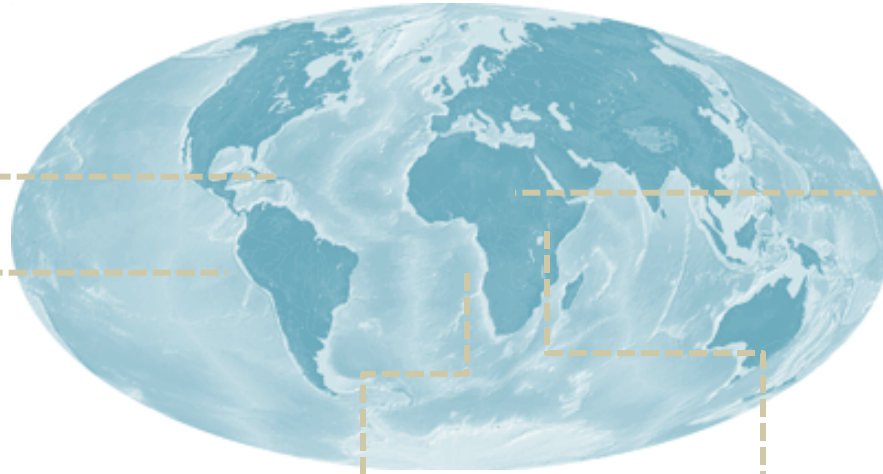

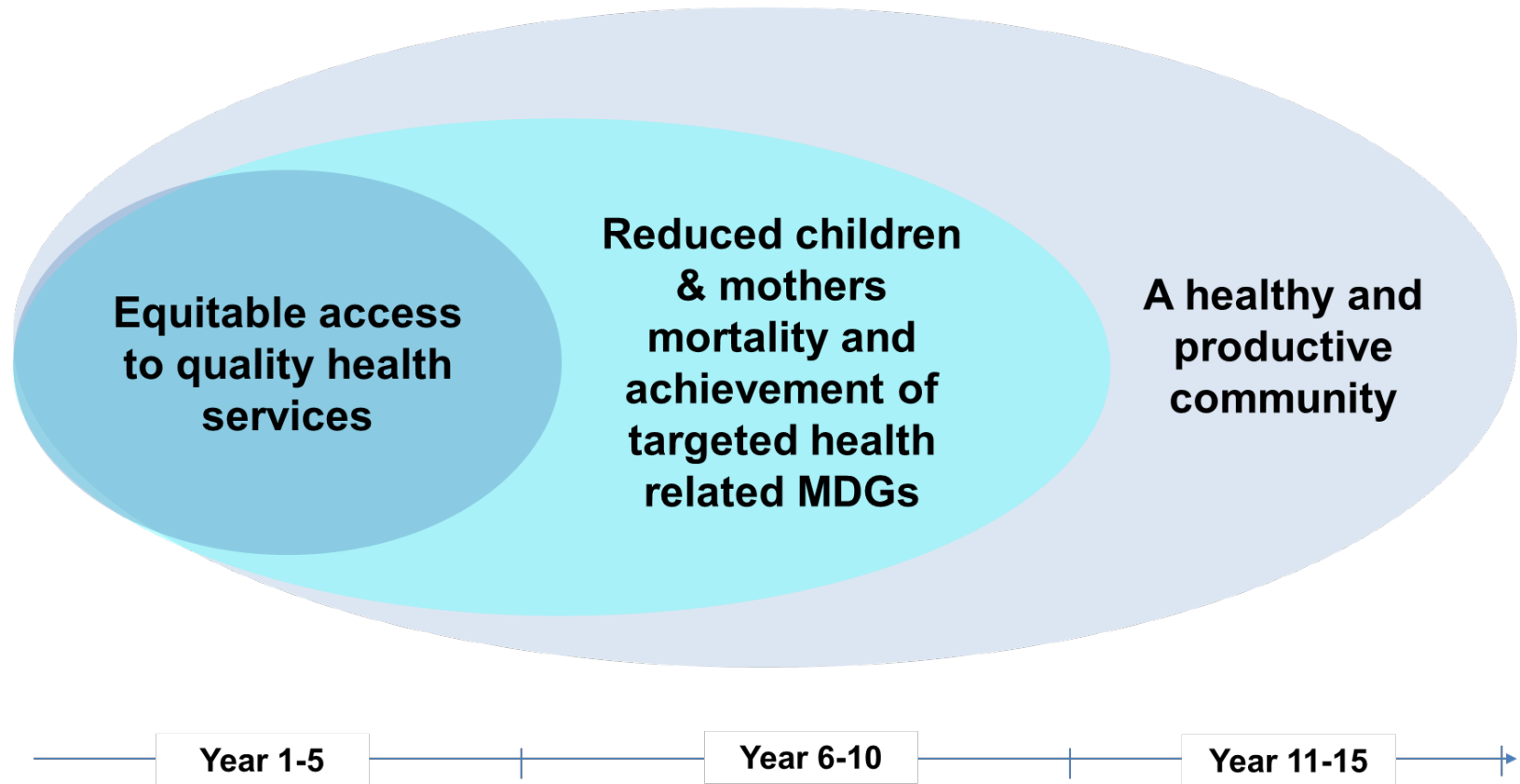

OVERVIEW: CHAMPS PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

- 1. Increase health-seeking awareness, knowledge, and behaviors around five locally identified public health issues.**
- 2. Expand access to health care services.**
- 3. Improve quality of services for women and children in the formal health system.**
- 4. Empower communities to identify, advocate for, and implement programs that improve community health and well-being.**
- 5. Ensure program monitoring and evaluation.**

RESULTS & CHALLENGES

1. HEALTH SYSTEMS

- 9 in South Sudan
 - 55 in Kenya
 - 13 in Haiti
 - 5 in Zambia
- 82 Hospitals
- Rehabilitating CHAMPS facilities
 - Training in stock management
 - Sourcing urgently needed equipment
 - Providing Human Resources for Health
 - Staff capacity building (e.g. training)
 - Expanding provision of services

2. ACCESS TO MEDICINES

- 169 consignees
 - 4 regions
 - 30 countries
 - 310 shipments
- Distributing medications
 - Strengthening health systems
 - Supporting medical missions
 - Responding to emergencies/crises
 - Addressing humanitarian needs
 - Addressing needs in CHAMPS and the surrounding health systems
