PQMD Holds Coffee Chat: Creating Greater Equity with GARDaccess to Rare Diseases Medicine

On August 15th, PQMD held its monthly Coffee Chat: Creating Greater Equity with GARDaccess to Rare Diseases Medicine.

In partnership with PQMD, expert advisors and stakeholders, the Global Alliance for Rare Diseases (GARDaccess) was designed to help create partnership and alliances for persons living with rare diseases and their families. This resource provides essential guidelines for those working with patients who have rare diseases and a framework to facilitate access to medicines that are otherwise not available to them in their local country.



PQMD Holds Member All-Call to Discuss Response to Maui Fires

On August 22nd, PQMD's Disaster and Humanitarian Response Committee held a disaster all-call, led by Christina Becherer, Committee Chair. Representatives from two of PQMD's newest members, Healthcare Ready and Good360, provided a situation overview including that (as of the date of the call), there were 115 deaths and still 850 people missing. Additionally, there are unsafe water advisories in Lahaina and Kua and 1850+ customers without power.

They also discussed the critical health infrastructure, the public sector healthcare response, and NGO response. Enormous amounts of infrastructure damage warrant significant recovery and resilience efforts. PQMD members are responding in a variety of ways, including by donating funds, medicines, medical supplies and hygiene kits.
