PQMD Holds Annual Global Health Policy Forum in New York City

Starting April 30th, PQMD held its annual Global Health Policy Forum: **Global Health Leadership in Turbulent Times** in New York City hosting more than 170 global health leaders from over 90 different organizations.

The 2024 Forum was an opportunity for our members and leaders in global health to address prioritizing multiple challenges while mitigating risk, fostering innovation, and doing more with less during these turbulent and uncertain times. The challenges include conflicts, disasters and climate change (especially in remote areas), and how they harm health and well-being.

To address these issues, Forum attendees discussed how to prioritize, mitigate, and innovate, focusing on disaster response and leveraging collective outcomes. We also discussed prioritizing humanity and anticipating the consequences of our decisions while simultaneously responding to the intense political, social, and economic changes in the world.

PQMD Holds PQMD Pillar Talk: Access to Global Surgical Care as a Moon Shot

In May, PQMD held a Pillar Talk on access to global surgical care. It is estimated that more than 5 billion people-nearly 2/3 of the population of our planet- lack access to urgent surgical care. During the presentation, we heard data and inspiration from leading neurosurgeon Dr. Gail Rosseau about this lack of access to one the most basic of human rights health. Using the example of President Kennedy's "Moonshot" speech in 1962 and the successful development of the Apollo program and manned lunar landing in 1969, Dr. Rosseau made the case for similar investment of time and resources for global surgical care.

International Medical Corps is responding to devastating floods in Puerto Rico and Afghanistan

In May, both Puerto Rico and Afghanistan communities were devasted by flooding. In response to the emergencies, International Medical Corps swiftly deployed assessment teams to both locations.

World Vision will assist 200,000 children in Brazil impacted by Rio Grande do Sul floods

World Vision is on the ground responding to widespread flooding in Brazil and will support 70,000 families and 200,000 children in Rio Grande do Sul. Record rains have killed 95 people, 131 are missing and over 400 communities have been affected.

World Vision is mobilizing donations and calling on the private sector to invest \$8 million in relief response to support the provision of psychosocial support, food baskets, drinking water, mattresses, bed, hygiene/sanitation and childcare kits, among other items.

Airlink Highlighted in the Loadstar: Logistics is the Key to Growing Humanitarian Needs

PQMD member Airlink was recently highlighted in the publication Loadstar discussing the importance of air carriers and logistics when addressing critical humanitarian crises and emergency response.

Last year, Airlink got aid into Haiti, Sudan, Afghanistan, Yemen, Syria, Tigray, and Iraq – with help from partners and donors. Airlink has more than 200 NGO and 50 airline partners.

Currently, Airlink is responding to the floods in Brazil's Rio Grande do Sul state. Reportedly, the Brazilian government has not issued a call for international assistance, limiting the ability of NGOs to respond. So Airlink has provided flights for humanitarian aid non-profit Cadena and is working on aid shipments on behalf of six NGOs.

In response to the humanitarian crisis in Gaza, Airlink flew four "hospitainers" from the manufacturer in the Netherlands to Egypt on behalf of the International Medical Corps. Essentially, these are hospitals in a shipping container and comprise specialized medical modules built around shipping containers and tents, which can be packed and transported by trucks.
