

Operation Smile Collaborates as Ghana Launches National Surgerical, Obstetric and Anesthesia Plan

On 3rd September 2024, the Ministry of Health of Ghana launched the country's first-ever National Surgical, Obstetric, and Anesthesia Plan (NSOAP). This NSOAP serves as a roadmap for improving access to quality and safe emergency and essential surgical, obstetric, trauma and anesthesia (SOTA) care across the nation. As a collaborator, Operation Smile's Policy and Advocacy team provided financial and technical support to the NSOAP Technical Working Group in Ghana to help bring this document to fruition.

This significant advancement in health care policy reflects the commitment of Ghana's health leaders to improve the lives of communities nationwide. Operation Smile is honored to have collaborated with the Ministry's experts, the Ghana College of Physicians and Surgeons, and the exceptional members of the Ghana NSOAP Technical Working Group and consultants. This initiative holds national significance and represents a monumental step forward, paving the way for a future where its implementation will positively impact millions of lives.
