Following a content-rich Global Health Policy Forum (GHPF) in London, PQMD members came together for our **May members-only Coffee Chat** to reflect on the insights shared and surface the themes they were most eager to explore further. Rather than revisiting the agenda, the conversation focused on identifying areas of collective energy and opportunity where PQMD can help deepen dialogue, amplify key perspectives, and catalyze collaborative action. This informal but intentional session sparked thoughtful exchange and laid the groundwork for continued engagement around the priorities that matter most to our community.



Better data makes better connections!

In the wake of the powerful 7.7 magnitude earthquake affecting Myanmar and Thailand, PQMD convened a **Member Disaster All-Call** to coordinate real-time response strategies. Members shared updates on their efforts to assess needs, navigate access constraints, and deliver critical aid in a highly complex and evolving environment. Activities underway included deploying medical response teams, providing trauma care and essential supplies, supporting mobile health units, sourcing clean water and hygiene kits, and addressing mental health and disease prevention needs. Members also shared plans for local procurement, collaboration with national health systems, and partnerships with trusted in-country NGOs.

PQMD's emergency all-calls play a vital role for members by enabling knowledge-sharing, alignment, and rapid mobilization across sectors when timely, coordinated action is most needed.



Working Group Spotlight: The AMI Group has been working directly with ASG advisors to contribute to the Aligned Metrics Initiative, which is developing a core set of aligned and relevant metrics for health product donations.

Member Interest Group Spotlight: The Logistics MIG has been leading discussions focused on practical problem-solving, where members discuss priorities in steering through the dynamic international logistics environment. Some recent topics have included shipping challenges and medical import requirements.
